Paving Update

The status of paving in our subdivision is a critical issue for our residents. Recent mild midwinter weather gave us all a reminder of spring, with potholes and gullies in our unpaved roads that proved treacherous to drive on and certainly esthetically frustrating! Our MLA, Bill Estabrooks, indicated to one resident that he had been in the area and taken some photos himself of the situation on our roads during the recent thaw, promising to add his voice to the many residents in our area requesting paving on our roads.

The status of Forest Glade Drive is that they have over 50 percent in favor of paving. However, when measured, the area of positive respondents is only 41 percent frontage. This appears to be due to the frontage of the empty lots, as only four responses were negative. As of the January 9 MLRA meeting, two more homes were left to be surveyed; even those votes were positive, the frontage would have to be reconfigured.

For Fiddle Parkway, the vote stands at 18 out of a possible 29, with only 3 'no' votes. Although this is encouraging, residents are reminded that frontage must still be measured.
